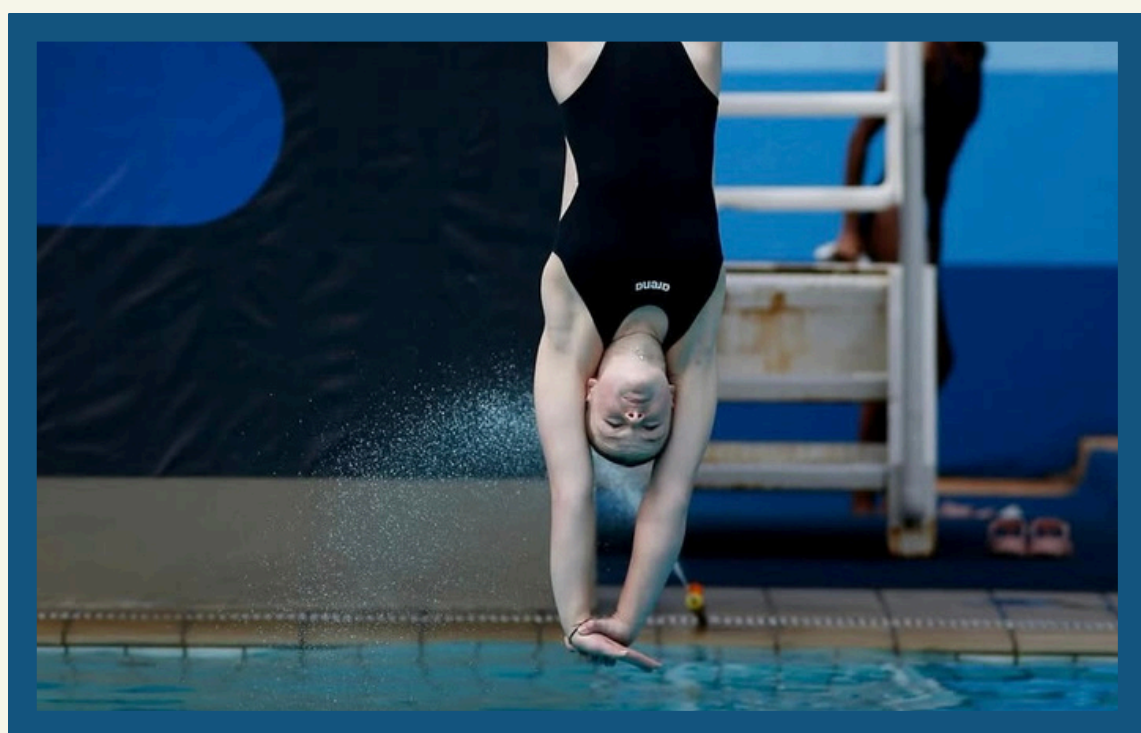
Malaysia Grand Prix

Liam Stone and Frazer Tavener competed at the Malaysia Grand Prix Event in early November alongside teammate Nathan Brown and Auckland Coach, Cordelia Norris. In the Mens 3m Final, Frazer placed 1st overall and Liam placed 3rd overall with some fantastic scores. Liam and Frazer also placed 1st overall in the Mens 3m Synchro event.



Pan Pacific Masters Games

Athletes Amelia Norris and Rhiannon Marryatt competed at Pan Pacific Masters Games in November alongside coach, Henry Hansen. The girls brought home some awesome results and some medals. Rhiannon placed 2nd and Amelia placed 3rd in the 19-24 years 1m event, Rhiannon placed 1st and Amelia placed 3rd in the 19-24 3m event, and Rhiannon placed 3rd and Amelia placed 4th in the 19-24 platform event. Brilliant results, well done girls!



World Junior Championships

Diving New Zealand sent a team over to World Junior Championships 2024 at the end of November. The event was held in Rio de Janeiro, Brazil and the team included three Auckland divers, Abraham Li, Noah Atkinson, and Pip Lee, Auckland coach, Cordelia Norris, and Wellington diver, Sophie Derbyshire. This is the top Junior diving event in the world with some fantastic young talent showing what they can do! Abraham did an excellent job at his second Junior World event, placing 31st in the Boys A 1m event and 28th in the Boys A Platform event. Noah debuted at his first World Juniors and placed 24th in the Boys B 3m event and 19th in the Boys B 1m event. Finally, Pip, who also debuted at her first World Juniors, placed 11th in the A/B Girls 3m Synchro event with synchro partner Sophie, 22nd in the Girls B 1m event, and 17th in the Girls B 3m event. Phenomenal results team NZ!

Georgia Fitzpatrick

Georgia is a member of our senior coaching team who works with a group of our Junior Performance athletes. She also assists on our Junior Development squad. Georgia started coaching in 2018 and first got involved in working with some of our 11 & under skills divers at the time. She then worked her way up coaching at an Age Group C/D level, and Junior Elite/Performance level.

Her University journey closely links in with her coaching. Georgia is currently studying exercise physiology and biomechanics and is going into her final year of study in 2025.

Georgia was born and raised in Switzerland before spending her teenage years in New Zealand. She started diving in 2018 and then fell in love with coaching 7 months later. Her favourite thing about coaching is working with her awesome athletes. A fun fact about Georgia is that her favourite food is tomatoes (although this may be an unpopular opinion for some!).



Henry Hansen

Henry is the lead coach of our Age Group A/B and 19-24 Years Squads. He starting diving in 2016 which was his first year of high school. Henry's favourite dive as a diver was 5231d on 3m, although he admits it was never the prettiest dive.

Henry is currently studying a Bachelor of Science in Sport and Exercise Science with a major in Biomechanics at Massey University. He pursued this pathway after years of coaching in this sport. His favourite thing about coaching is pulling harness. *"I love this part of my job as it's where I feel I have the most impact on the athletes I'm working with. I find it especially exciting when the diver is learning something new".*

One of Henry's goals in the sport is to coach at a major international event, whether that be at a junior level, or a senior level further down the track. Something you may not know about Henry is that he loves playing and writing music. If he wasn't coaching he thinks he'd probably be pursuing a career in music!

READING DIVE NUMBERS

Auckland Diving

Reading Dive Numbers

All dives have an associated dive number code which is used in events and by coaches to identify a dive. Reading dive numbers can be a tricky thing to learn

All dives are identified by three or four digits and one letter. Twisting dives utilize four numerical digits, while all other dives use three.

1 0 1 A

Group Flying(?) #½ Rotations Position

Twist Group Direction # ½ Rotations # ½ Twists Position

1. The first digit indicates the dive's group: 1 = forward, 2 = back, 3 = reverse, 4 = inward, 5 = twisting, 6 = armstand.

2. In front, back, reverse, and inward dives, a '1' as the second digit indicates a flying action. A '0' indicates none. In twisting and armstand dives, the second digit indicates the dive's group (forward, back, reverse).

3. The third digit indicates the number of half somersaults.

4. The fourth digit, if applicable, indicates the number of half twists.

5. The letter indicates body position: A = straight, B = pike, C = tuck, D = free.

* 102 B: Forward somersault pike.

* 201 C: Back dive tuck.

* 405 B: Inward 2 1/2 pike.

* 5231 D: Back 1 1/2 with 1/2 twist.

* 303 C: Reverse 1 1/2 tuck.

* 612 B: Forward armstand, one somersault pike.

* 5134 D: Forward 1 1/2 with 2 twists.

* 109 C: Forward 4 1/2 tuck.

* 113 B: Forward flying 1 1/2 (Forward 1 1/2 with one 'fly').

* 626 C: Backwards armstand triple somersault tuck.

* 302 A: Reverse somersault straight.

* 5331 D: Reverse 1 1/2 somersault, half twist.
